: OBSERVANCE OF THE WARITIME AND ARCHIPELAGIC

NATION AWARENESS MONTH (MANA Mo) 2025

DATE

Pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 316, s. 2017, the month of September of every year is declared as the "Maritime and Archipelagic Nation Awareness Month" (MANA Mo). The purpose of the celebration is, among others, to harmonize, integrate, and synchronize programs and activities that will raise national consciousness on maritime and archipelagic issues and policies.¹

The Office of the President (OP) issued Memorandum Circular (NC) No. 87, s. 2025 directing all national government agencies and instrumentalities, including government-owned and -controlled corporations, and encouraging all local government units (LGUs) and the private sector, to:

- Actively support and promote the conduct of relevant programs, campaigns, and initiatives that raise the awareness of the Philippines as a Maritime and Archipelagic Nation; and
- Render full support and cooperation in the implementation of activities in observance of MANA Mo every September.

The said MC was issued to further strengthen public awareness, national consciousness, and intergenerational appreciation of the Philippine territory and maritime zone, including inter-agency cooperation and collaboration in advancing maritime and archipelagic awareness towards sustainable development, security, and protection of the country's maritime domain and heritage.

In view of the foregoing, all LGUs are hereby highly encouraged to implement and enact the following:

1. Provision of support for the celebration of MANA Mo 2025 through:

¹ To synchronize the observance of the Fish Conservation Week with the International Coastal Clean-up Day and the National Maritime Day, which are celebrated in September, Proclamation No. 176, s. 1963 was amended to transfer the said celebration from the third week of October to the third week of September of every year, beginning in 2018.

- The issuance of resolutions by the local Sanggunian that declare support for the celebration of MANA Mo 2025 and the localized celebration thereof; — Sb
- b. Presenting the message of the President on MANA Mo 2025 on the Mondays of September 2025 during the flag-raising ceremonies, to be disseminated by this Department once available; — HRMO
- d. Holding public symposiums with themes related to maritime awareness; CA
- Institutionalization of SEAtizen Friday where employees of all LGUs are encouraged to wear blue every Friday of September 2025; and — CA
- Other activities which the LGU may deem ideal for strengthening the awareness of the Philippines as a Maritime and Archipelagic Nation.
- Submission of an Activity Matrix to the Presidential Office for Maritime Concerns. The sample matrix may be accessed through and submitted directly to the <u>recommenced processed on</u>, preferably on or before August 15, 2025.

All DILG Regional, Provincial, and Field Offices are hereby directed to cause the widest dissemination of this issuance and OP MC No. 87, s. 2025 to their respective areas of jurisdiction.

This Memorandum Circular shall take effect immediately.
